Meeting Called to Order

Inasmuch as this was the Reorganization Meeting, Mrs. Jane Panichelli called the meeting to order.

Election of Officers

It was moved by Dr. Judith Venuto, seconded by Mr. Henry Eichman, that Mr. Robert Bell be nominated for President of the Health Advisory Board for 2007.

There being no further nominations for the office, Mr. Robert Bell was declared President of the Health Advisory Board for 2007.

Mrs. Jane Panichelli conducted the election for the Office of Vice President of the Health Advisory Board for 2007.

There being no further nominations for the office, Dr. Denis Boyle was declared Vice President of the Health Advisory Board for 2007.

The meeting was continued by Dr. Denis Boyle, due to the absence of Mr. Robert Bell, who will preside for all further business.

Approval of Minutes

Old Business

Mr. Spangler stated that on December 7th we received a complaint from a person who stated she had gotten sick from cheeseburgers she purchased at the Burger King on West Chester Pike saying the burgers were not hot and the cheese was not even melted. As usual this had happened about five (5) days before she made us aware of this. We went over and checked the establishment. They used to set the burgers up on a warmer. Now what they do is cook them until they are cooked and then put them into the microwave with cheese. The woman did not go for any kind of analysis for any type of food poisoning. She went to the manager and talked to her. Basically, the complaint is not verified. The problem with these calls is that you can't come in a week or two later as it is not doing us any good. Discussion ensued.

Old Business (con't.):

There was a fire on December 13th at the Palombaro Club located on E. County Line Road and Chestnut Ave. They had remodeled and the fire started upstairs from the fryolator. Smoke damage and water damage occurred on both floors and the Club is not opened as yet. This really messed them up with all the functions they had scheduled for the holidays. They brought an outside company into clean, sanitize and refurbish the place. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Spangler mentioned that a complaint was received on December 14th regarding unsanitary conditions at the Great Beginnings Daycare located at Temple Lutheran Church on Earlington Road and Brookline Blvd. We do not get involved too much with these daycares that are located in a number of churches. Basically, this is governed by the Department of Public Welfare Office. We contacted the Philadelphia Office giving them the pertinent information, as well as the complaint about the complainant's child being bitten by the same child and corrective action is not being taken. Hereafter, when someone complains the Department of Public Welfare said they can contact them directly.

Mr. Spangler stated that he received a complaint that an employee of the Head Nut with long nails was breaking up coconuts with her bare hands and bagging it. The owner was informed that food gloves are required when working with ready-to-eat foods. We also noted that fake nails could fall off without realizing it. We will keep a check as needed.

Renewal license applications were sent out early in the month for 2007 licensing. Applications have been coming in steadily, but we still have the same stragglers every year that have to be threatened with a certified letter, or else even a citation, if they fail to comply with the applicable fee to be returned by the 1st of January.

Old Business

Mr. Spangler stated that we received a complaint on January 3rd regarding cloudy dirty water at the Falcon Center Pool. It gets cloudy because it is an old concrete pool. We went in there and told

them they would have to drain the pool, dry it out and then sandblast it. They got on it right away and it should be good for another four or five years. Discussion ensued.

We received a call on January 12th from the PA Department of Health concerning possible food poisonings at a party catered by the Bryn Mawr Pub which is in our Township. The party was held at the Wharton Dry Cleaners on January 5th which is on the Lower Merion side of Lancaster Ave. Supposedly, seven out of eight people had eaten Corn Beef Specials with Swiss cheese, coleslaw and Russian dressing and got sick within an hour. None of them was treated at the doctors or emergency room to confirm this. Mr. Spangler spoke with a rep from the state. If it was from food poisoning, it would have to be Bacillus Cereus Gastroenteritis with such a quick onset. There were no other cases reported.

Mr. Spangler stated that we were contacted by a rep of Kindred Health Care on January 16th which will be opening at the old Mercy Hospital facility and they will be using the dining area and kitchen facility. Probably by early next month we will be in there for some preliminary and final inspections. Discussion ensued.

A representative from the Friends of the Grange contacted us on January 18th requesting requirements for caterers who bring foods to events at their facility. I informed them as in the past they should request a copy of the caterer's license and proof that food is being prepared in a commercial facility that has been inspected.

The Health and Codes Departments conducted initial inspections of Frankies Café, Bar & Restaurant, 25 S. Eagle Road on January 25th. This was originally Anthony's Café. They were approved and licensed to open for business. Discussion ensued.

Dimeo Pizza at 1304 West Chester Pike had a change of ownership. It was one of the employees that took over on January 25th. They were approved and licensed for business. The Health and Codes Departments did initial inspections.

Mr. Spangler mentioned that a prospective new owner of the former Papa Lindy's Restaurant at 20 E. Eagle Rd. visited the office during the month. We provided him with an application and a copy of the ordinance as he intends to open a Tai restaurant in the near future.

Mr. Spangler stated we received a complaint concerning dirty conditions at the TLC Preschool at Llandillo and Lansdowne Rds. on September 24, 2006, and forwarded it to the local Pennsylvania Department of Welfare Office. We received an actual letter this month indicating they were there on the 3rd of October. The letter indicated it was a legitimate complaint as they found dirty conditions and a citation was issued to the operators. A follow-up visit indicated corrective action was taken and compliance was received. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Spangler was awakened by the Haverford Township police around 12:30 AM last month regarding a fire at the Porto Rosa Pizzeria on West Chester Pike. This is the 2nd time they have

had a fire. They left 3 rolls in the oven which caused some smoke. One of the fireman from the Manoa Fire Company wanted the Health Department there since food was involved so Mr. Spangler had to drive up. In the meantime, we found out that they had a new owner. The old owner had just paid for their license for 2007. However, since he was a new owner he had to come into the office and pay for a new license. This business seems to be running much smoother now that the old owner is out of there.

Meeting Called to Order

The Meeting was called to order by Dr. Denis Boyle, Vice President of the Health Advisory Board.

Approval of Minutes

Old Business

Mr. Spangler stated that on February 3rd we received a complaint that people are feeding the seagulls at Manoa Shopping Center. This has increased the population and has created a public health nuisance. It is private property and the Center owners do not want them there. We did

identify a person and a certified letter was sent out regarding this matter. It seems to have resolved itself. We will keep a check on this situation. Discussion ensued.

A complaint came in on February 8th from a person who was calling for her son who had eaten a cheeseburger and french fries at the Burger King on West Chester Pike and ended up at Paoli Hospital with food poisoning. I tried to find out if it was confirmed or not. A check of Burger King came up with nothing out of the ordinary. We did not receive any other calls nor did Burger King. The complainant has not called back with a diagnosis.

Mr. Spangler mentioned that on February 21st we received a letter from the PA Department of Welfare Office in Philadelphia. He had contacted their office back on 12/8/06, regarding a resident's complaint of unsanitary conditions at the Great Beginnings Daycare I on Brookline Blvd. & Earlington Rd. and also his child has been bitten by another child numerous times. They are licensed through them. They investigated this matter on 12/22/06, and did find regulatory violations. A citation was issued against the operator. A recheck did verify correction of noncompliance and we will now direct these type of calls directly to their Philadelphia Office for follow-up.

The Health & Codes Departments conducted initial inspections on February 21st of Porto Rosa Pizzeria as this was a change of ownership. They were approved and licensed to do business. There is talk that they are going to change their name.

Mr. Spangler stated that back in December there was a fire at the Palombaro Club in Ardmore, We visited on February 23rd along with the Codes Officer and Fire Marshal. As of this time neither one of the kitchens is operable for food preparation. They have events there but a caterer has to bring the food in for now. They were given a conditional U&O for certain usage of the facility. We will keep an eye on the progress and do a final inspection when they are ready.

Mr. Spangler received a call on February 28th from a person who stated her friend had gotten sick almost immediately after eating sushi at the Sampan Inn and she had also gotten sick before that and will not eat there again. I asked her if her friend was being treated or diagnosed with food poisoning and she was not sure. It is possible that the rice could have caused the illness. The PA Department of Agriculture has guidelines for PH meter to target a PH of 4.1 or less but not to exceed 4.6. When we got there they did not have the meter or it wasn't operable. Mr. Spangler thought that they were not doing the record keeping procedures for these readings and had no records on file at the time of our visit. A recheck indicated they had gotten a meter and are taking their loggings and readings. There were no other complaints and we never heard back from the complainant as to whether there was an official diagnosis of food poisoning. We did find out they were not in compliance with the state regulations. We let the state know and they can follow up as necessary. A copy of the PDA Guidelines regarding sushi is enclosed.

Mr. Spangler stated that Kindred Health Care is going to be a full care facility with ventilator only patients. Right now they are operating in the Lanckenau Hospital. The Health and Codes

The Health and Codes Departments will do initial inspections prior to licensing them to open for business at the Old Haverford Mercy site. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Spangler mentioned that we have not heard anymore from the prospective owner of a Thai Restaurant. They are to be located at 20 E. Eagle Rd., the former Papa Lindy's.

Adjournment

Old Business

Mr. Spangler stated that on March 12th the owner of a proposed new establishment, LaDolce Bakery visited the office. They currently have a bakery in Radnor. They are Havertown residents and happened to find the location at 101 W. Eagle Road. They gave us a set of plans and they

are now in the process of putting the place together. The Health and Codes Departments will conduct preliminary and final inspections prior to their opening. Discussion ensued.

The Health and Codes Departments conducted initial inspections on March 14th of the Szechuan Lei Lei Restaurant located in the back part of the Manoa Shopping Center. It is basically the same operation just different owners.

Mr. Spangler mentioned that on March 16th the Health and Codes Departments conducted initial inspections of a new establishment, Suk Ho Thai Cuisine, 20 E. Eagle Rd., which was the Old Coffee Break and Papa Lindy's after that. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Spangler stated that he was contacted by Bob Pierson from Farm to City Farmers Markets. What they do is set up farmers markets in different locations a day a week or sometimes two. They sell different goods - sometimes produce, meat, dairy products, baked goods, etc.. They have their products in different locations such as Philadelphia, Swarthmore Boro, Chester and Montgomery Counties. We are in the process now of getting them the proper licensing. They are going to be operating out of the Oakmont Parking Lot, the back section on Wednesdays between the hours of 3 to 7 PM. They will have tents. They do not prepare anything on the premises and the meat products are coming from Montgomery County licensed butchers inspected by the County. Any meat coming in has to be USDA packed and everything has to be prepackaged. We do have inspection rights and the vendors will be licensed through Farm & City and they also have to have a Mercantile License.

Mr. Spangler mentioned that a representative from a new proposed establishment, Pretzel Boys, visited the office on March 22nd. They will be located at 39 Brookline Blvd., formerly Larko Printing. Pretzel Boys is a franchise. We will be inspecting them. It may be sometime in late April or even May.

The Ivy Inn, 37 Brookline Blvd., changed ownership on March 27th. We did inspections there, and they were approved and licensed to open for business.

An application and fee was received on March 28th for the Kindred Health Care Facility. They hope to get open by the end of April, but more than likely it will be in May.

Mr. Spangler stated that on March 29th we received a complaint from a person who ate at Applebee's the night before, and she used a glass from the bar, as well as a plate and silverware which were all spotted and dirty. It was brought to the attention of the staff and they brought out some replacement items and they were also dirty. We checked it out the next day and they have a very sophisticated dishwasher and high temperature machine. However, they were waiting for service on the rinse cycle. This was causing the spotting and they were not necessarily dirty. If they are having this problem until it is fixed, they should have washed the dishes or wiped them down. We will check this on a daily basis. Discussion ensued:

Old Business (con't.):

A copy was given to the Board on our Annual Rabies Clinic. The date of the Clinic is going to be April 21, 2007, from 10:00 AM - 12:00 Noon. Dr. Bronstein and Dr. Guiliani are going to be the local vets and it is being held at the Oakmont Firehouse. The price is \$2.00 per animal. We have contacted the local newspapers, Cable TV, and churches to help us promote our Clinic. The Commissioners were also notified as well. Discussion ensued.

The Meeting was called to order by Dr. Robert M. Bell, President of the Health Advisory Board.

Approval of Minutes

Approval of Reports

Old Business

Mr. Spangler stated that Farm to City Market which we discussed in last month's report sent in an application and license fee on April 9th. It will be opening on May 23rd at the back end of the Oakmont Parking Lot on Wednesdays from 3:00 to 7:00 PM. They will be setting up about 2:00 PM and we will be there to take a look.

Old Business con't.:

Mr. Spangler mentioned we received a complaint on April 9th that an employee of Paganos was making hoagies, then using the phone and adding machine without washing his hands. We checked it out and when we were there the person doing the hoagies was wearing gloves and the person doing the phones and adding machine was up front. Supposedly, there were two people on and we cannot really substantiate that. We will continue to monitor this. Discussion ensued.

We had a complaint regarding the Food Source Store having tamper proof bait boxes around the place put there by their exterminator. What we suggested as they had a couple of them up by the front entrance which makes people feel a little queasy was to move them toward the side and the back of the store. They did concentrate on the back trash delivery areas..

Mr. Spangler stated that on April 18th John Williamson, a contractor for the Goldenberg Group, the ones who purchased Haverford State Hospital property visited our office. They are the same group that is going to do the demolition and also the construction. We discussed the demolition and the need for rodent baiting prior to such activity. Mr. Williamson visited again on April 21st and their exterminator Orkin, will be placing bait stations around the building on May 1st. They will monitor this up until the demolition begins on May 22nd and what happens the bait stations just become part of the demolition debris. There should not be any issues there. You have more when it is done in the middle of a neighborhood. Dr. Boyle asked if all the asbestos had been removed yet. Mr. Spangler said it had, but he did not get involved in that. That would be a Codes issue and they have been involved in that. Discussion ensued.

There was a small electrical fire in Whitehall Hall at Haverford College. We were notified by the Fire Marshal. A few containers of food were disposed of and a general cleanup was done, and they are now back in operation.

A complaint was received on April 20th that a person on Coopertown Road was draining their pool. Actually, they had Suburban Pool Services there and it was draining onto his neighbor's property. They informed us that the liquid chlorine was balanced prior to draining it to the street and were not aware it was going onto the neighbor's property. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Spangler stated that we had a Rabies Clinic at the Oakmont Fire Company on April 21st. A total of 95 animals was inoculated which is 16 more than we did last year - 62 dogs and 36 cats. Dr. Bronstein and Dr. Guiliani donated their time and the Oakmont Fire Company for the use of their facility.

Mr. Spangler mentioned that on the 24th of April the Health and Codes Departments conducted initial inspections of Tip O'Leary's Saloon, formerly the Quarry Inn. The people who bought it also have an interest in W. C. Murphy's Pub on West Chester Pike. This is a change of ownership and it has greatly improved. Discussion ensued.

Old Business con't.:

We received a complaint on April 30th regarding Steel Field with trash cans overflowing and garbage and trash all over. We turned it over to the Public Works Department and Recreation Department.

Vito's Hoagie Shop - Mr. Spangler said he would update it because we will actually be doing the initial inspection tomorrow. It is located in the L&M Shopping Center next to Dominoes. It is going to be strictly hoagies and cold sandwiches.

Regarding the proposed establishment, Pretzel Boys, they opened up Saturday May 5th. They are located at 39 Brookline Blvd. This is a franchise. They sell super size pretzels for a \$1.00 and toppings are extra. They also sell water ice and soft ice cream.

Kindred Health Care, the old Haverford Mercy Hospital and LaDolce Bakery, 101 W. Eagle Rd. discussed last month should be opening sometime this month. Kindred Health Care will be housing patients on ventilators. They are relocating from the 5th floor at Lankenau Hospital.

New Business

Mr. Bell announced to the Board that he was going to be moving out of the Township and also the County once he sells his house. He is relocating to the Green Hill Apts. on City Line. He will inquire to the Acting Township Manager whether he can stay on the Board. Discussion ensued.

Adjournment

He never showed for the hearing. He has 8 or 9 citations which will go to Media and he has 30 days to appeal. If he doesn't appeal, we can get an appellate ruling from the County Court to go in and rectify the problem and lien the property. Discussion ensued.

Old Business (con't.):

Mr. Spangler mentioned that he was contacted by a representative from the Philadelphia Breast Cancer Walk on 9/18 which actually went through our Township and needed a license to have some refreshments at the Lynnewood School. We gave them an itinerant license which is a nonprofit no fee charge. We faxed the application to them.

Mr. Spangler stated that on September 20th the Health and Codes Departments conducted inspections of the Wawa on Darby Road. They were closed for a few weeks for remodeling and were approved to reopen for business.

A complaint was received on September 24th regarding mice being sighted at the Acme Market. A patron went to the basement and saw a mouse running around. We spoke to the manager and they have since contacted their exterminator. They also had the exterminator take a look at the Jaguar Lot which has been purchased by Acme as that could be a source as well. Discussion ensued.

Mr Spangler stated that we had another complaint on September 24th regarding trash in the little alley behind the Food Source and bait stations that appear to not being serviced for sometime. The customers were wondering what all the bait stations were doing there. The end line is that they are not having a problem. They had the exterminator back to remove some of them, and the manager was instructed to keep their side of the alleyway clean. We will continue to monitor this.

Mr. Spangler mentioned that on September 24th we received a complaint regarding Fruits & Veggies on Haverford Road having an overgrowth of trees and shrubs. The owner was informed and he did clean up alongside the building and the back. We will monitor this.

Initial inspections were conducted on September 25th at Dunkin Donuts on West Chester Pike. This is just a change of ownership.

The dates and times have been established for the Flu Clinics for those residents who are eligible. The vaccine is purchased through the University of Pennsylvania Health System and their RN's will administer the vaccine. Discussion ensued.

Our office was contacted during the month by a rep from Asiana Cuisine Enterprises. They are taking over the Sushi Bar operation at the Food Source Market on Lancaster Ave. in Bryn Mawr. They are out of Gardena, California. They just opened for business the 1st week of October.

The Kindred Health Care Facility is open and received all their needed inspections and approvals. We approved their kitchen and dining areas weeks ago as their area was completely redone and in compliance with our Health Codes.

Old Business (con't.):

New Business

The Township Manager wanted the Health Department Budget in by September 30th. We didn't fill our animal officer part-time position this year, and whether we fill it this coming year, remains to be seen. If it is not filled, Mr. Spangler would like to increase the overtime budget this coming year. David Hesington, Jr. has filled in sometimes when our Animal Officer was not available. Discussion ensued.

Adjournment

Mr. Spangler mentioned that on December 1st we conducted an initial inspection of Asiana Cuisine. They are the same group that is at the Food Source in Bryn Mawr. They opened a Sushi Bar operation in the Super Fresh after they were approved and licensed.

We again noticed a problem on December 10th with the trash storage for the Bakery House, Philly Pretzel Factory, and Pizza Palace, located in the 600 block of Lancaster Ave. It is still not perfect. Hopefully, we will get it straightened out, or we will have to start issuing citations. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Spangler stated that we had a complaint on December 11th regarding another sewerage backup. It has been going on for probably 5 or 6 years in the 2600 block of E. County Line Road. The establishments supposedly involved were Carlino's, McGillicuddy's and the Italian American Club. However, they all checked out fine. The Township rechecked their line and found some severe problems with our line. It has been scheduled for an extensive replacement this year when the weather is warmer. It is not always the establishments that are causing the problems.

The dogs from 625 Valley View Road that were attacking people and other dogs are no longer there now. We will file a Dangerous Dog Determination with the local Justice of the Peace if the dogs are brought back into the Township. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Spangler mentioned the problem with grease on the ground in the dumpster area at the L&M Center, is making some progress. All three (3) establishments were contacted by certified letter, as well as the owner and each one is denying that they are at fault. We will monitor this and if it is not taken care of we will cite them all.

Regarding, 2516 Avon Road, the house with the green pool and other violations, we filed all the pertinent information with our solicitor and he will file such with the County Court to hopefully grant the Township the right to correct the violations and lien the property for costs of such. Mr. Spangler heard the house is up for foreclosure and he may have already lost it.

Mr. Spangler stated that our 2008 renewal licenses and fees are steadily coming in and we will send out a final notice to those who have not responded. It was suggested by Dr. Venuto and Mr. Eichman that we should charge a monthly late fee. Mr. Spangler thought that would be a good idea and he said he would check it out with the Solicitor. Discussion ensued.

We did complete school inspections in December, public and parochial schools. We did cafeterias for the parochial schools and we did complete school inspections of all the public schools. If you have the dog's license number, you put it in and it will give you the dog's name and the owner's phone number.

Old Business (con't.):

A complaint was received on February 7th from a parent of a child regarding Chatham Park Elementary School. We were informed a mouse was in the classroom and Mr. Spangler contacted the Director of Maintenance for the School District. They do have regular inspections through Aardvark Pest Management. They will contact them for another inspection.

Mr. Spangler stated that on February 21st we were informed by a parent of a student from Haverford College who was calling from Mississippi that they were having an ongoing problem in some of the dorm rooms with mice, and that the situation was not being properly addressed. They now have a new Veterinary Director and will continue to support our program. Dr. Lillian Guiliani was also contacted and will volunteer her time. We took pictures and called the owner of the Pretzel Factory. He said that he was to have a pickup 3 or 4 times a week, however there was not one until the following Monday. We will continue to monitor this and if this problem is not corrected he will be cited. Discussion ensued.

The former Lotus Cuisine, 2371 Haverford Road was reinspected on March 20th. It is now called Harasume Japanese Restaurant. They are the same owners. They shut down for about a month to remodel. We inspected them and approved it along with the Codes Department. They did not have to pay as they are the same owners. We did a new license since they changed their name.

Mr. Spangler mentioned he received a call from a neighbor on March 26th regarding the dogs at 623 Valley View Road stating that they were back at the house again. We left a notice and finally the owner called back. The State Dog Warden was going to pursue the Dangerous Dog Determination against her when she decided to get rid of the dogs, and we would hold this as long as the dogs are not back in the Township. When I spoke to her, she said the dogs were just in the car. She asked if they could be there a day a week. She had paid the fines for citations issued several times for dog attacks they were involved in, and she was told the dogs could not be there at all even in the car. This will be turned over to the State Dog Warden if they are back. Discussion ensued

The Health and Codes Departments conducted initial inspections on March 26th of the Cross Roads Café, 1270 Township Line Road. It is a coffee shop operation located inside the St. Edmonds Federal Savings Bank. They were approved and licensed to open for business. Discussion ensued.

The dog at 2 Hastings Ave. was running at large again. On two (2) previous occasions the dog apparently went after other animals, This dog did attack a dog being walked by it's owner. The dog was seriously injured and taken to the University of Pennsylvania Hospital. Again, it went after another person's dog, but was caught in time by it's owner. Three years ago the dog also got out and attacked and killed 3 chickens in a neighbor's chicken coop. At this point Mr. Spangler has decided to contact the Delaware County Dog Warden to see if a Dangerous Dog Determination is in order.

The Annual Rabies Inoculation Clinic discussed last month is set for April 26th. A flier is attached with all the pertinent information.

Mr. Spangler stated that during the month he spoke with the owner of a proposed new establishment, Char-Lee's Burgers, 800 Eagle Road. We talked to them today and they should be ready in about a week or so for a preliminary inspection, and will hopefully be ready to open for business in two weeks..

The violations at 2516 Avon Road are not corrected yet. This is the property that had a number of citations. The house went to Sheriff's sale the end of 2007. The bank took it over and we have been dealing with an attorney who was trying to correct the problems, drain the pool and clean up the property, etc.. On September 1st we received a complaint regarding dirty floors and counters at the Burger King on West Chester Pike. We did check and it did reveal for a need for a cleanup. We did do a reinspection and they did take care of the issue. Discussion ensued.

Old Business (con't.):

Mr. Spangler stated that we were notified on September 15th of more positive mosquitoes for West Nile Virus in the traps at the Merion Golf Course. The County did an ATV and hand held spraying of the Golf Course. It was actually confined to the Golf Course.

We received a complaint from the owner of Colonial Village Meat Market in Manoa Shopping Center on September 16th regarding the area where there is a huge dumpster and a couple of grease bins. The grease is suppose to go in the smaller bins, but instead is being put in the large dumpster. As it sets in there for awhile, it becomes a problem with the odors. We contacted the owner of the center who is never very cooperative. They now have a different maintenance company and it was cleaned up quite quickly. We will monitor this to make sure compliance is being kept.

Mr. Spangler mentioned that on September 16th we sent out letters to various food establishment to inform them that the windows and doors must be kept closed or screened to prevent flies and vermin from entering. This is in effect until December 1st as per our Health Code. We sent out 10 or 12 letters and most of them have complied except the Lamplighter. They built an out cove rounded with windows that you can actually open that gives the appearance of outdoor dining, but it is still indoor dining. He has screens for the two windows in the middle and not the side ones. We will send a 2nd letter and if this does not work, then he will be cited. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Spangler stated that we had a report on September 22nd of a Jack & Jill Vending Vehicle selling products in our Township. One of our inspectors saw him selling in Merwood Park for the St. Denis football practice. They were not licensed to vend in our Township. I contacted the Supervisor and he said they were licensed in Lower Merion. He was told that if we see him again, he will pay a \$300.00 fine if he is not licensed.

Initial inspections were done on September 24th of a new establishment, Samurai Japanese Sushi Steak House located on Township Line Road. It was formerly Pat's Pizzeria. This establishment was approved and licensed to open for business. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Spangler completed his final update training session on September 24th. Mr. Spangler and Susan Cook, Health Inspector, submitted their application fee and update credits to the PA Department of Agriculture. They received their license and it is good until October 2011.

Mr. Spangler stated that on the 29th of September the gentleman at 1707 Robinson Ave. owned a couple of dogs - one a Rotweiler and Black Lab. One dog got out in April and chased somebody down and tried to get hold of his dog. Then on the 29th of September The two dogs went to the house behind them. A lady was ready to walk her 10 month old and had a bagel on the stroller. She turned around and the dogs were there and she

literally shielded the child and threw the bagel into the yard and ran into the house. The dogs ran up the street and a man was coming out of the house and they ran up and ran into his house and pinned his dog down. He was a big guy and he literally grabbed the two dogs and threw them out. There was a dog walker walking two 17 pound little dogs from Harriet Lane. The one managed to get away, but the other one was thrown around like a rag doll. The same big guy came down with an aluminum baseball bat and broke the two dogs loose. The ACO and the police got the Rotweiler and transported him to the SPCA and the black Lab was put into his yard. We filed a \$2,000.00 citation against each dog and turned it over to the Dangerous Dog Determination. Those dogs are not allowed out on the property unless they are in an enclosed pen, and they can only be taken off the premises on a lead and muzzled if they are taken to the Vet. Discussion ensued.

We have our 2008 Flu Clinics scheduled for eligible Township residents. A flier attached detailing the date. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Spangler mentioned that the Dunkin Donuts on West Chester Pike has been closed down for a couple of weeks for a major remodeling. They will reopen in October.

Mr. Spangler stated that a gentleman had gone into the Head Nut on October 2nd and was concerned regarding unlabeled packages of nuts and candies. They break it down into

smaller bags, and what they are supposed to do is either put a label on the bag, or have it posted where you buy the product. He was complaining that he spoke with the owner and was told that he did not have to do that which was untrue. Mr. Spangler informed the Department of Agriculture because they handle all labeling procedures. An inspector visited and spoke to the people at the Head Nut and got everything straightened out. Discussion ensued.

On October 14th we received a complaint concerning an insect found inside a can of America's Choice Cranberry Sauce purchased at the Super Fresh. This problem obviously happened where it was manufactured. Agriculture was also in on that and their inspector will report the results to the complainant. We have not received anymore complaints.

Mr. Spangler mentioned that on October 15th the Lamplighter Tavern was not screening all openings to the outside as per our earlier letter. A certified letter was sent to the owner and screening is required from April 1st until December 1st according to our regulations. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Spangler stated that he conducted an initial inspection on October 17th of a new vending vehicle, Liberty Beef, who solicits frozen meats and fish in the community. The truck is mechanically refrigerated and maintained at 0 degrees F or cooler. They were approved and licensed to operate in the Township.

Our Annual Influenza Immunization Clinics were conducted on October 20th and 27th in conjunction with the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania. It was a great success and we did 583 Township residents, mostly senior citizens. Our employees were also given shots for the 2nd or 3rd time earlier in the month.

A complaint was received on October 20th regarding unsanitary conditions in the dining and restroom areas at the Manoa and Diner Deli. An inspection did reveal some issues and they were notified to correct the sanitation problems. In the meantime the business has been sold. Their liquor license went thru and they are now doing a lot of remodeling and renovations which had been needed for a couple of years. The former owners were operating on a limited budget and we should see improvements with the new owners. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Spangler said he received a complaint on October 21st regarding mice sightings inside the Food Source Market. An inspection did reveal a problem. They also had a problem a year ago or so. They have bait boxes and are diligently exterminating and have proof of such.

Mr. Spangler stated that on October 21st we received a complaint regarding a mold problem in the basement storage area of the CVS on West Chester Pike. They have

always had a water problem in that area. They hired a company in early November to remove the mold and have repaired or replaced the dehumidifier. The endline is that they are dealing with the problem.

The Health and Codes Departments conducted initial inspections of Tip O'Leary's of Bryn Mawr, formerly the Bryn Mawr Pub around November 21st. They were approved and licensed to open for business.

A complaint was received on October 23rd regarding the possible changing of code dates and improper labeling at the Asiana Cuisine Sushi Bar located in the Super Fresh Market. Asiana Cuisine has nothing to do with Super Fresh. They rent space there and have a separate license. They also have a sushi bar at Food Source, and various other markets. It was turned over the PA Department of Agriculture as it is basically their responsibility to follow up.

Mr. Spangler stated that he, Nancy and Susan, attended the Delaware County Local Boards of Health Meeting held at the Marple Township Building on October 29th. They had a speaker from the PA Department of Health and he did a presentation on the State's new smoking laws in public places. The State is looking to fine tune this law to deal with various loopholes that exist. Also, they dealt with the West Nile Virus Program and available Influenza Clinic locations for Delaware County residents. They have these programs about every three months which last about 3 hours or so and are very informative. You get a free lunch as well. Discussion ensued.

basically did was add the fancy coffee type section . It is actually not self-serve and is done behind the counter.

A complaint was received by the Health Department by a resident from 629 Kenilworth Road. Their home is attached to 631 Kenilworth Road and along the roofline they have obvious openings for squirrels entering the home. They are traveling between these two (2) units. 631 is a rental property with two young tenants that could care less. We contacted the owner who lives in California and since then it has been pretty well taken care of as he hired an exterminator who trapped them and sealed up the opening. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Spangler discussed that we conducted a routine inspection of Centrella's Deli on January 14th and noticed various prepackaged items for sale without proper labeling. We informed the owner before of this same situation. If you break products down you have to package it and label it with the store name, phone number, common name of the food, and ingredients in descending order. This is a PA Department of Agriculture Law. He has since gotten labels with his address and he has ordered new labels with the ingredients.

Mr. Spangler stated that we conducted an inspection of Super Fresh on January 16th as they are in the process of a major remodeling program. They had put up a whole new group of fluorescent lights and there were no covers or caps. They inquired if shatter proof fluorescent bulbs can be used in food prep areas. The Department of Agriculture stated this is fine in accordance with the Food Code. We will monitor the work being done.

Mr. Spangler was contacted by the School District on January 22nd as they suspected a possible food poisoning outbreak at a catered event on January 15th. They informed us of a local caterer, Season Caterers, who was actually located in Lower Merion. Our concern was to find out if they were actually licensed. They were licensed through Montgomery County. Mr. Rotolli from the School District actually did a survey and stated that 35 people became ill with diarrhea and vomiting even though some of the people had eaten the same food. The most important thing is they had to have blood work, stools and a laboratory diagnosis. None of them did. Since the caterer was not from Haverford Township, the School District will have to follow up with Montgomery County. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Spangler mentioned that we received a call on January 26th that Applebee's had no running water and that people could not flush the toilets or wash their hands. They did have a water main break which affected the entire shopping center. They shut down for approximately two hours until it was repaired. We checked it out the next day and all was in compliance with Township Codes.

Old Business

Mr. Spangler stated that we had a resident come in from 901 Darby Road. There is a row of properties from 901 to 917 which are all connected. What happened is that all the residents keep their trash cans at the back of the property which is in the alley. There is a large pillar in the back of the alley preventing the trash trucks from going through so on trash days they have to be taken out front right at the corner of Valley and Darby Rds. The neighbor at 901 wanted to know why all the trash cans were in front of her property. We then sent letters from 901 to 917 telling them that the trash, recycling and bulk item pickups had to be in front of their own houses. We have been monitoring this and it seems the residents are following the procedures. Discussion ensued.

A complaint was received from the parent of a student at Haverford College on 2/19 who resides in the Haverford College E Building for a mouse issue. The apartments will officially be taken over by Haverford College in June. It is being run by a management firm right now. They had a similar issue on campus last year. The parent was concerned that she didn't think the issues were being addressed. Mr. Spangler contacted the Maintenance Director for the school and they brought in their exterminating company, Ardmark. The management firm also gave them permission to exterminate. Part of the problem is they have to educate the students about leaving food out. I told the parent to contact the Director of Maintenance. Hopefully, they are getting this situation resolved as there have been no additional complaints.

Mr. Spangler and the two Health Inspectors attended the West Nile Program on February 25th put on by the PA Department of Health. You try to notify people ahead - 48 hours notice for ATV spraying and 72 hours for aerial spraying. This way people will have time to make their own decisions. Overall, they think we will have a significant amount of positive mosquitoes this year. The County will be setting up some additional meetings through the Intercommunity Health Coordination Office. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Spangler stated that he had completed the PA Department of Health Annual Report Form. We will submit it before the March 28th deadline. I will get a copy for each of the Board Members.

Old Business

On March 11th we conducted an inspection of Murphy's Pub located at 1254 West Chester Pike next to McDonald's. We had a complaint and there was an issue with the grease drums with no lids. We contacted MOPAC and they put new drums in there. We also had a problem with a leak from one of the toilets. It was leaking into the restaurant below. The ceiling was repaired. We are also working with the owner of that building as the restaurant below is having some floor issues as well.

Mr. Spangler mentioned that we conducted an inspection of the Sampan Inn on March 13th and noted several operational and sanitation violations. We did a reinspection of the restaurant on March 23rd and the sanitation violations were corrected, but there were still a few operational violations. Basically, it was just not that clean. So, we read them the riot act and they did a nice job of getting it straightened out. The Japanese side of the restaurant was fine. The last thing to be checked was the hood system which had to be cleaned professionally up to the roof. There had been a lot of grease build-up. The problems were corrected. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Spangler stated that he and the two inspectors attended the Delaware County Local Boards of Health Meeting at the Radnor Township Building. Various topics were discussed. They gave us an update on West Nile Virus, as well as a report of the John Hopkins University Public Health Study for Delaware County. There's been a push by some people to have a County Health Department. The last thing to be discussed was an update on the County Strategic National Stockpile and Pandemic Plan. These meetings are generally held every couple of months.

Mr. Spangler mentioned that on March 30th there was another carbon monoxide scare forcing the evacuation of the Super Fresh Food Market, and a few adjoining businesses. The paramedics and the firemen were there early in the morning. The carbon monoxide detector had gone off and the problem was a defective heat exchanger for the large oven in the bakery. Fortunately, it was caught very quickly and it was red tagged for repairs. The store opened within a couple of hours.

We were notified by District Court that hearings are scheduled for the owner of 1213 Darby Road on May 5th. These are the ones where there are trash issues that were not corrected. It took \$900.00 worth of fines and now he is very attentive.

New Business

Our Rabies Clinic is this Saturday, April 18th. Dr. Cecelia Helenski is going to participate and help us give out the shots. Dr. Giuliani is retired now and it is being held at the Bon Air Fire Company this year from 10:00 AM until 12:00 Noon for \$2.00 a shot.

Mr. Spangler stated that on August 7th we conducted an inspection of the Karakung Pool which the previous weekend had been closed due to contamination from the creek from heavy rains It dumped all the muddy murky water into the pool; the pool was drained

and we went down and took some readings. Then we also required them to have a bacteriological analysis done. They brought a lab in to do the analysis and once that was done they were good to go. Discussion ensued.

Our staff attended "A Cooking for Crowds Workshop" held at the Brookhaven Boro Hall on August 11th. It was geared towards bake sales, cook outs like the churches have, pancake day, what people should and should not do, and also to educate people who do their own type of cook outs. It was very informative. They gave out nice booklets which were put out by the Pennsylvania Department of Health in conjunction with Penn State Extension Services. Discussion ensued.

On August 12th Carl Spangler and Susan Cook hosted an informative session at the Township Building for Boy Scout Requirements for their merit badges. One of the merit badges dealt with speaking to a government official and finding out what their particular department does. It was quite interesting. There were 9 or 10 boy scouts and their scout leader, Dr. Wolanan, a local dentist, as well as some of their parents. The Scout Leader sent a very nice thank you letter to the Township Manager for a very professional presentation. What was impressive about it was there were some very young boys that really wanted to learn something.

Mr. Spangler met our liaison Commissioner Jim McGarrity on August 19th regarding the Proposed Budget for 2010. After a few minor adjustments, I completed it and submitted it to the Finance Director. A copy of that is in your printout. Basically, the salaries are governed by the Contract. What we deal with is the operational costs and the line items. It is similar to last year with a few cutbacks to the line items. We were able to keep our flu shots in there and that looks like it will happen again next year.

During the month Mr. Spangler was contacted by a rep from Ridgewell Caterers located in Bethesda, Maryland. They will be heading the food concession for the upcoming Walker Cup which is being held at the Merion Golf Club. It is actually September 10th-13th. Nancy, Sue and I will be doing an inspection tomorrow of the four (4) different stations prepared by their caterers where they will be setting up tents. They have forwarded all pertinent licenses and information, and have completed the application and paid all license fees.

We have begun receiving applications for food vendors who will be participating in Haverford Township Day on October 3rd. As usual our inspectors will be on hand that day to ensure proper food handling procedures are being followed.

Mr. Spangler was contacted by the owner of a new establishment Primo Hoagies, which is a chain. It was originally D'Maio's Pizza on West Chester Pike. The Health and Codes Departments will conduct initial inspections when they are ready in about two (2)

Mr. Eichman was talking to Mr. Spangler outside. We are pleased to inform the Board that Nancy Guerra and Susan Cook, our two health inspectors, took and passed the State Civil Service Examination. They will be receiving Certificates now and they will be certified as Health/Sanitary Officers in the State of Pennsylvania. Mr. Eichman thought it would be nice to give them a Proclamation on behalf of the Health Advisory Board acknowledging their achievement on getting this.

The last thing Mr. Spangler mentioned is that it is getting towards the flu season. He is trying to get a definite answer from the Township Manager. It does appear that we will definitely be going on with it. It is amazing with the Swine Flu scare the number of calls we are getting already.
